

Frightful Scandal at The Detroit Curling Club – In 1911 the members of The Detroit Curling Club, true sportsmen and good fellows, were up in arms. "Unless something is done very soon, there is no telling what the membership will be forced to do." It is all on account of <u>J. Wilson</u>.

For years, this man had been enjoying all the privileges of The Club without ever having been initiated into the select circle or even invited to join. Neither had he paid so much as a cent for dues. Things got so bad that the board of directors held a secret meeting to devise ways of ridding the


curling club of Wilson's presence. "J. Wilson must go" became the slogan of the entire membership. The trouble seems to be that no one can identify him.

"Some evenings the fellow is described as tall and at other times he is short", says the club president. "On Monday he was clean-shaven and on Tuesday he had a full beard." It had been said that he resembled many of the popular players. Once in a while, it is said he looked like Ben Van Zandt. Other times he had the appearance of W.A. McWhitney. He even looked like one of the Dodge brothers.

"The fellow must be suppressed", stated Dr. Forrest, "He is altogether too bold. He comes up here and curls more games than any other member, yet nobody seems to know anything about him. Sometimes he is the best curler on the ice. Other days he is awful."

"He is one of the best skips we have, yet sometimes he will be playing lead or second. He certainly is a versatile person and a curling enthusiast, for he is at the club nearly every night."

During the years of J. Wilson's appearances, The Club had a friendly reporter at the Detroit Free Press, and he published the nightly box-scores in the next morning's edition of the newspaper. From a large collection of clippings, we have found J. Wilson curling at The Club from 1908 through 1914. Here are a couple of examples:

On a typical evening, J. Wilson entered the clubhouse and proceeded to the draw sheet. He would erase someone's name and insert his own. Then he would proceed to the ice and enjoy the game. After the newspaper was published the next morning no one knew whose place he took on the ice.

We have now learned that *J. Wilson* was an alias assumed by any and all of the canny Scots when they did not wish their presence at The Club to be known for various reasons. Ever since The Club has been in existence, and a man has told his wife that he is detained at the office, or has to go to Grand Rapids on business, he has chosen this *nom de guerre*. Nobody knows who invented it, nor when, but the fact remains that J. Wilson is a much over-worked man during the winter months. I am fiddle-footed,

Communication and Website News

DCC Website Instructions for Signing In – Every member should be aware of the procedures to set up your accessibility to all the great web site features. If you have not signed in yet, follow these instructions and save your user name and password to stay informed. Keep these instructions handy in case you forget your sign in information.

Retrieving Your Username & Password

You will only be able to complete these steps once you are seeing the new website when you go to www.detroitcurlingclub.com. If you do not see, "Forgot Login," as mentioned below you will need to wait a while and try loading the site again.

- 1. On the right side, under the Member Login section, click on the words Forgot Login.
- 2. Click to check the box for Lost Username and a space to enter your email address will appear.
- 3. Enter you email address and click the Send Username button. If you see a message that your email address does not exist on the site, please emailmembership@detroitcurlingclub.com so we can update your email address.
- 4. Check your email and you should receive a message with your username.
- 5. Return to the DCC website and again click on the words Forgot Login under the Member Login section.
- 6. Click to check the box for Lost Password and spaces for entering both your username and email address will appear.
- 7. Enter both your username and password and click the Send Password button.
- 8. Check your email and you should receive a message with a new password.
- 9. Return to the DCC website and use your username and new password to log in.

Changing Your Password

- 1. After you have logged in, click on My Information under the Member Menu on the right side.
- 2. Near the top left of your profile click on Edit and then choose Update Your Profile.
- 3. Click on User Info to switch to the username and password settings.
- 4. Enter your desired password in the space provided, and enter it again in the Verify Password field.
- 5. Click the Update button to save your changes.
