## **House Business**

Club Progress – Much work has been done over the summer to get the club ready for the curling season. Work on the knee wall went smoothly, thanks to all the volunteers who were able to come out and help. Friday July 6, we had 11 volunteers that spent the better part of the day building. The guys broke into teams and went about their work in a most professional manner. Friday's volunteers included Roger York, Jim McCutcheon, Jeff Deneen, Larry Aubuchon, Frank Duffy, Paul Arsenault, Lee Evans, Dave Palmer, Tim McGee, Bret Jackson and of course myself. We used up all the metal framing and came up short 5 studs.

Saturday, Day 2, started at noon. The reason for the later start was because the main power panel was replaced in the morning hours. When we arrived, the new power panel installation was complete and there was no evidence that anyone had been there. Nice work Mark! Well, the crew went straight to work completing the unfinished framing and fastening the new frames to the building structure. The work was completed by 3 PM.

The next step was to apply the spray foam insulation. I'd like to thank the following volunteers who came out to work on Saturday. Namely myself, Lee Evans (who brought some well-deserved refreshments), Dave Palmer, Phil Brosnan, Kevin Ingraham, Jim McCutcheon, Tim McGee, Larry Aubuchon and our past president Jim Morris. These are special people and I cannot thank them enough for lending a helping hand.

On Monday morning, July 9 at 9 AM, 11 volunteers arrived to help with the arena knee wall project. WOW! After going over the detailed process of what needed to be done, the guys formed into teams and started in on the work. The insulation process started around 10:30 and by two o'clock in the afternoon, the process was complete. Special thanks to the following volunteers; Dave Hesse, Frank Duffy, Todd Gault, Jim McCutcheon, Jeff Deneen, Tim McGee, Larry Aubuchon, Roger York, Duke Grimshaw, Sam Kilby, and Dave Palmer. The completed work looks very professional and is going to make a big difference in the quality of our new ice.

Wednesday started out at 9 AM with everyone who committed to help being on time and ready for work. The day was spent cleaning up the foam application and installing the wall sheathing. The panels went up fairly easy and the guys broke into groups of two or three and divided the work steps that made the installation go quickly and with a very high level of quality craftsmanship. These guys are really good! Completion of the sheathing installation was at 3 PM. Six hours to install 40 sheets of sheathing was really fast! The material estimates to date have been quite accurate with the exception of the foam insulation. We have one extra set of canisters that did not get used. We hope we can find a buyer for the material. A special thanks to today's volunteers, Lee Evans, Jim McCutcheon, Larry Aubuchon, Sam Kilby, Kevin and Todd Gault, Dave Hesse, Jeff Deneen, Paul Arsenault and little old me. We are about 4 days ahead of schedule. WOW! What a great bunch of guys! A very special thanks to Dave Hesse who brought the day's refreshments. Dave, you are the best!

Well, we are rapidly approaching the end of the week and the FRP panels are going up. The crew arrived promptly at 9 AM. It was a slow start this morning but we managed to get four of the fourteen bays completed. The process of installing the frp is more involved and requires more time to complete. The panels have to be fully adhered to the sheathing and the edges are finished with a special trim. By 3 PM the team had worked out all the bugs of preparing and installing the first twelve panels. We originally thought the process could be completed in two days. Again, a special thanks to Larry Aubuchon for starting the work party this morning. Also a heart-felt thank you to Sam Kilby, Duke Grimshaw, Dave Hesse, Paul Arsenault and Lee Evans for spending their day working on this important project.

The knee wall project moved along at a very good pace. The Friday team included Tim McGee, Jim McCutcheon, Lee Evans, Duke Grimshaw, Paul Arsenault, Dave Palmer, Roger York and chief slave driver John Danckaert. At the end of Thursday, the estimated completion of the frp installation was revised to Monday because only four of the fourteen bays had been completed. That schedule was revised again because the guys developed a system that increased production to the point that all the bays were completed by 4 PM Friday. And, there was even time to prime the masonry wall under the glass. At the end of the seven hour day, the team had finished off the top quality installation. The next step is to install the wall cap and seal all the joints at the floor and columns. The bright white walls will make a bigger impact once the new ice is in place. The carpet squares will need to be trimmed once the boards are installed. But we will deal with that detail when the time comes. In the meantime, the team is very proud of the results they have achieved.

The project started on Friday July 6 and is expected to be fully completed on Wednesday July 18. A total of 9 working days. The target completion date was set at July 20 assuming 15 working days. The original project budget was set at \$9,724.00. The actual total expenses to date amount to \$8,707.50. That puts us under budget by \$1,016.50. Total estimated time invested in the project 415 hours. There were a total of 18 who volunteered on the project. When divided equally between the volunteers, the time invested is over 23 hrs/person. Seven (7) prime members invested in excess of 40 hrs. Those persons are Larry Aubuchon, Tim McGee, Jim McCutcheon, Dave Palmer, Sam Kilby, Lee Evans, and John Danckaert. These guys were the constant thread that kept everything moving

smoothly while finding ways to maximize material efficiencies. These guys and the others worked thru some very hot and muggy weather and never complained. Even when we skipped right over lunch!

The change in the arena appearance is immediately noticeable. We also are very optimistic that the ice conditions will be much improved. We will certainly know more, once the season is underway. Those that donated their time, talents and tools should be very proud of their accomplishment. I am proud to have been given the opportunity to make this significant improvement to our club and to have worked side by side with some of our club's best members.

Thanks Jim, Lee, Duke, Jeff, Frank, Paul, Dave P., Sam, Todd, Kevin G., Kevin I., Larry, Chris, Roger, Bret, Phil, and Dave T. You guys are some of the best people in our club. Thank You - a thousand times. A special thanks to my dear wife, Louise, who worked with me when we were acquiring and delivering all the building materials to the club. She was a great help when I needed it most.
