Ladies Monday League – The Laura Call rink (pictured at left) versus the Pamela Buchkowski rink final began promptly at 3 PM, seeking to win the prestigious Lee Davis Trophy. The score volleyed back and forth throughout the game, neither team giving much ground to the other. The Buchkowski rink fought hard to keep the scoring close but to no avail. Both rinks have a mix of new and experienced curlers, so at the opening salvo either team had a great opportunity to take the game all the way to a win. The final result ended with Tom Nowaczok skipping his team to the win. The game had its moments when crucial shots could swing the lead to one side or the other. Emotional responses from the crowd behind the glass ebbed and flowed with each shot made, sometimes screaming in celebration of a shot well executed or groaning over the less-than-desired outcome. Excitement was ever present and evident throughout the warm room. The final outcome was not determined until the last rock was thrown. Well done Team Nowaczok!

<u>Champagne Spiel – With all the excellent curling displayed throughout the day, there was one last event to complete.</u> The annual tradition pits the newer curlers (5 years and under), known as the "Colts" pitted against the more experienced curlers, known as the "Old Goats" to earn the prize of free champagne. Traditionally, the Old Goats have had the advantage of experience and treachery to overcome the youth and enthusiasm of the Colts. The evening competition consists of three four-end draws, with the cumulative score tally of all four sheets revealing which group wins the prize. To turn the tables, the champagne is purchased by the losing group and served to the winning group. The battle began with the Colts being spotted six points due to the lack of Old Goats signed up to play. The disadvantage played well in the hands of the Colts, maintaining

DCC Website Instructions for Signing In – Every member should be aware of the procedures to set up your accessibility to all the great web site features. If you have not signed in yet, follow these instructions and save your user name and password to stay informed. Keep these instructions handy in case you forget your sign in information.

Retrieving Your Username & Password

You will only be able to complete these steps once you are seeing the new website when you go to www.detroitcurlingclub.com. If you do not see, "Forgot Login," as mentioned below you will need to wait a while and try loading the site again.

- 1. On the right side, under the Member Login section, click on the words Forgot Login.
- 2. Click to check the box for Lost Username and a space to enter your email address will appear.
- 3. Enter you email address and click the Send Username button. If you see a message that your email address does not exist on the site, please emailmembership@detroitcurlingclub.com so we can update your email address.
- 4. Check your email and you should receive a message with your username.
- 5. Return to the DCC website and again click on the words Forgot Login under the Member Login section.
- 6. Click to check the box for Lost Password and spaces for entering both your username and email address will appear.
- 7. Enter both your username and password and click the Send Password button.
- 8. Check your email and you should receive a message with a new password.
- 9. Return to the DCC website and use your username and new password to log in.

Changing Your Password

- 1. After you have logged in, click on My Information under the Member Menu on the right side.
- 2. Near the top left of your profile click on Edit and then choose Update Your Profile.
- 3. Click on User Info to switch to the username and password settings.
- 4. Enter your desired password in the space provided, and enter it again in the Verify Password field.
