## **House Business**

Annual Meeting Report (reported by J. Danckaert) – The Annual meeting, held at the club facilities on Wednesday, April 14, 2019 before about 45 attendees, began promptly at 7:00 PM. Attending members submitted their votes for those they favored to replace retiring board members Josh Lopez, Roger York, Mark Hansell and Gordy Loud. Votes were collected for candidates to replace retiring GLCA, USCA, USWCA and OCA representatives along with our own DCC Trustee.

**President, Ben Levy,** delivered a heart-felt speech summarizing the season's major events and club accomplishments. He gave a general thank you to all those who volunteered their time and talents spent on club improvements, bonspiels, special events, Learn-to-Curl, club operations and administration. The results of which continue to improve and grow our club on an annual basis. Finally he thanked everyone present for helping him to cope and manage the responsibilities of being President.

**Diana Jankowski** delivered the Treasurer's Report. After the pluses and minuses were tallied, the net result reported \$186,160 income for the season as of March 31. The balance sheet shows no long-term liabilities and cash-on-hand, which includes the general accounts plus the Rockettes and Sinners accounts at \$236,769. The Trustee account as of March 31, 2019 totals \$743,685 with deposits made to date amounting to \$560,000. The Board recommended investing \$100,000 into the investment account, leaving approximately \$150,000 to cover end-of-season and summer improvement expenses plus season opening expenses for the 2019-20 season.

**Duke Grimshaw** reported the club invested \$275,000 with the club financial advisor, LPL Financial on December, 31, 2018. And since that initial investment, the account has steadily grown to \$748,688 as of April 1, 2019. For the period from March 31, 2018 to April 1, 2019, the fund grew by \$138,013. (6.10%). The Trustees do not plan to make any investment strategy changes at the present time.

**Mike Grudzinski** reported on the Learn-to-Curl program indicating volunteer response at approximately 80 members, consistent with last year's participation. Michael indicated the program continues to be very successful because of the quality of the volunteers that assist in the training and coaching. Sign-ups following the mini-bonspiel amounted to 50 new members. Michael is planning on two sessions for the coming season and is confident the members will strongly support the effort again.

**Josh Lopez** reported we had 12 hosted events at the club this past season. That is an average of a hosted event every two weeks. The final event is the Motor City Open to be held from May 3-5. The event has been booked solid for several weeks and promises to become a significant event well into the future. Josh extended a special acknowledgement to Eric Kortebein for delivering the best ice this club has had since it's opening in 2002. Josh promises to have several summer activities for members to enjoy and advises everyone to watch the Scots Wha Hae for news updates.

**Ben Levy** reported our membership count is the highest it has ever been, holding at 334 members. His report indicated the membership breakdown at 196 Class A, 111 Class B, 11 Class C, and 16 Life members. It was also reported that 25 current members have history with the club dating back to the Forest and Haggerty facilities. Remarkable dedication to the sport and the club!

Mark Hansell reported the club facilities had a significant number of big improvements including the upgraded insulation and finishing of the arena knee walls, and all the improvements to the warm room. A special thanks was extended to John Danckaert for spearheading these two major improvements. Additionally, several electrical improvements were made in support of the areas lighting and power distribution in the warm room, Pro Shop and kitchen. The experiment with a new cleaning service netted a less-than-desirable result and will be addressed during the summer. All safety and health inspections went well, without incident. Mark extended a heart-felt thanks to all who volunteered to pick up, mop up, lock up and/or donated time and talent to make our facilities operate smoothly and efficiently.

**John Danckaert** reported the Scots Wha Hae (SWH) and Pro Shop are healthy. He asks all members to keep the membership advised of their adventures during the off months by sending news items to the SWH. John stated he will be offering new items into the Pro Shop next season. Watch for updates in the SWH. Finally, he gave special mention of Lynden Gault, who is the Chief Editor of the SWH, acknowledging the fact that without Lynden, we would not have a newsletter! She is the "glue" that keeps the newsletter going weekly.

**Brooke Schneider's** bar report summarized the membership approval of the third beer tap, the introduction of a variety of craft beers during the season, the addition of Michigan wines and liquors and the much improved billing and payment system put into place this year. Proposals for an additional cooler and more appropriate storage for the pantry will be submitted to the board during the off season. A special thanks went out to Tom Nowaczok and Chris Thomas (beer), Jeff Deneen (liquor), Laura Call (wine) and Bartenders Derek Gossett and Frank Stephens.

Laura Gilchrist reported 148 members volunteered to support club activities this past season. This is the first time a true tally of who volunteered how much has been tracked for an entire season. The numbers are decent, but not outstanding. She stressed that less than half the membership is contributing. A total of 2,012 hours were logged. That is the equivalent of two persons working 8.4 hrs/day, five days per week, for six months. The sign-up web site offered 753 unique volunteer opportunities. Members filled 409, and many of them were repeat volunteers. The weakest category was help maintaining the ice. Laura stressed this is a mostly volunteer club, and as such, every member needs to contribute and the best way is to use the web site.

**Dan Maggio and Gordy Loud** reported another record setting season of the rental program. Over 450 requests were handled and the net profit generated by the program is estimated to be \$130,000. The highest percentage of revenue occurred in December, followed by April. The most popular days are on the weekends and the least rented time is on Wednesday, in case you are thinking of renting some time. A special thanks was extended to those members who come in to manage our guests. They are obviously doing things right!

**Duke Grimshaw** was pleased with the growth and skill level within the Juniors Program. The 3rd Annual Jr. Bonspiel had 12 teams participate. Currently DCC has 3 members while Midland has <u>four teams</u>. He is working on a minijunior program for children, ages 3-6. (His grandkids). Special thanks to Dallas Schneider, Fred Zosel, Pete Sylvain, Joe George, Geoff and Kelly Soerens, Martin de la Merced and Diana Jankowski for all their help in the program.

Adam Rivera named 20 members that contributed their time and talents to making the ice some of the best we have ever seen since opening in 2002. (Refer to the full Annual Report for more detail.). The board is currently soliciting bids to replace the arena lighting with new LED fixtures. Stay tuned for more updates in the SWH. Roger York thanked each of the league drawmasters for their time and creative energy to make the nightly leagues fun and desirable. Roger developed a detailed breakdown of the membership by leagues and class status for the purpose of analyzing what leagues need help, or what days/nights might be considered to expand or redefine the league system. This approach shows much potential for the new strategic planning committee.

**Duke Grimshaw and Fred Zosel** discussed the upcoming first meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee, scheduled to meet on Thursday, May 9 at the DCC facilities. Time of the meeting was not indicated. Duke indicated the board is investigating possible improvements to the web site on both the front and back ends. More will be forthcoming on this topic after the new board meets.

**Ben Levy** reported on regional GLCA business that affects DCC. The Women's team of Ann Swisshelm, Elizabeth Demers, Jenny Levy, Melissa Turbow and Suzanne Hansell won the ladies regional event in march at the Lakeville, Minn Curling Club. Next season, DCC will be hosting the regional club championships. Ben noted if any DCC member attended there or more regional club events this past season, a special pin will be given to you. Ask Paul Badgero, Ben Levy or Josh Lopez for more information. Finally, the spring GLCA meeting will be in Bowling Green on Saturday, May 11, 2019, and is open to anyone wanting to attend.

**Bethany Rivera** reported on the USWCA as our representative. Elizabeth Demers has been nominated to the USWCA Board. She also heads up the Digital and Technology Advancement Committee. Maryanne Wessels provides

creative support to the organization. Next season the National Women's Bonspiel will be held in Seattle, Washington, and the Sr. National Bonspiel will be in Albany, New York.

**Dave Nelsen** will be taking over the reigns as our OCA-Zone 16 representative from Ben Levy. Brooke Schneider will remain our second rep.

**Dave Nelsen** reported the Sinners will be making a proposal to the board to cover the cost to replace the warm room chairs. Dave also mentioned the next major event sponsored by the Sinners will be the annual KW/DCC Exchange happening on November 9-11, 2019.

Laura Call reported the Rockettes are supporting the Women's International spiel and the Meat & Greet spiel next season. They will also be offering food sales, tee shirts and hoodies, and help with the ice next season. The Rockettes provide sticky mats, business cards, warm room furniture, prizes for inhouse bonspiels and a new draw curtain to obscure the daylight glare problem emanating from the front entrance. The newly elected Rockettes Board Members are Pam Buchkowski, Bonnie Czander and Stephanie Grant.

Awards are given each year to deserving members who have made significant contributions to the club and the membership. Several members were nominated and it is the job of the President to select one person to receive the President's Award (formerly known as the Will Oliver Award). This award this year went to Larry Aubuchon. According to Ben, his contributions as a one of our newer members was outstanding and has made a substantial difference in our club. Congratulations Larry! Additionally, members are named to the Chuck Thomas Award to honor their sportsmanship, on and off the ice. These individuals (one a veteran and one a member for 7 years or less) are recognized for promoting the spirit of the game and the club, and for their willingness to share in that spirit. This year we congratulate Bill Morris and Melissa Turbow (pictured at right). Thank you for all you do!



#### **Communication and Website News**

**DCC Website Instructions for Signing In –** Every member should be aware of the procedures to set up your accessibility to all the great web site features. If you have not signed in yet, follow these instructions and save your user name and password to stay informed. Keep these instructions handy in case you forget your sign in information.

#### Retrieving Your Username & Password

You will only be able to complete these steps once you are seeing the new website when you go to www.detroitcurlingclub.com. If you do not see, "Forgot Login," as mentioned below you will need to wait a while and try loading the site again.

- 1. On the right side, under the Member Login section, click on the words Forgot Login.
- 2. Click to check the box for Lost Username and a space to enter your email address will appear.
- 3. Enter you email address and click the Send Username button. If you see a message that your email address does not exist on the site, please emailmembership@detroitcurlingclub.com so we can update your email address.
- 4. Check your email and you should receive a message with your username.
- 5. Return to the DCC website and again click on the words Forgot Login under the Member Login section.
- 6. Click to check the box for Lost Password and spaces for entering both your username and email address will appear.
- 7. Enter both your username and password and click the Send Password button.
- 8. Check your email and you should receive a message with a new password.
- 9. Return to the DCC website and use your username and new password to log in.

#### Changing Your Password

- 1. After you have logged in, click on My Information under the Member Menu on the right side.
- 2. Near the top left of your profile click on Edit and then choose Update Your Profile.
- 3. Click on User Info to switch to the username and password settings.
- 4. Enter your desired password in the space provided, and enter it again in the Verify Password field.
- 5. Click the Update button to save your changes.
